has the ONLY BARRIER REEF IN THE CONTINENTAL US, and is home to seven species of Endangered Species Act-listed corals.

As a result of the widening of the Panama Canal, ports along the Eastern seaboard are racing to accomodate the next-generation of super-sized container ships.

THE PORT OF MIAMI WAS THE FIRST ON THE LIST.

IN NOVEMBER 2013, The Army Corps of Engineers began dredging the shipping channel of PortMiami.


